



Ray'z Barbering Program

A training program for students who want to transition into entry-level careers as barbers. Students take hands on classes that teach them how to cut and style for men and women and provide chemical services. In addition, students learn about the barber history, shop management and barber laws. The school will provide the student with specific skills necessary to pass state licensure examination and to be gainfully employed in the Barber/Styling profession.

Requirements for Application

- Applicant must provide a copy of his/her U.S. High School Diploma, GED,
- Must be at least 16 years old
- Valid Social Security card
- Valid Illinois ID

Curriculum Requirements

Ray'z Barber College provides a curriculum of a minimum of 1500 hours as follows:

- a) 150 hours of classroom instruction in general theory which shall be divided into specific subject areas as specified in subsection (b) below.
- b) 1350 hours shall be practiced on the clinic floor and shall be at the direction of the instructor based on the instructor's evaluation of the individual's needs.

Ray'z requires each candidate for graduation to pass a final examination that tests the students theoretical and practical knowledge of the curriculum studied.

A passing score of 75 or greater shall be required on both the theoretical and practical portions of the final exam.

The school shall allow each candidate for graduation at least 3 attempts to pass the exam.

Theory/Class Guidelines

Class day will take place on Wednesdays form 9:00am-5:00pm and will be mandatory. This is where you will receive lecture, demonstrations, and practical hands on training. Theory is done more independently but will go hand in hand with class days.

Theory/class attendance will be mandatory to complete your 150 hours of lectures, demonstrations and discussions of the following:
